- The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires that each Title I school hold an annual meeting of Title I families in order to:
 - inform you of your school's participation in Title I,
 - explain the requirements of Title I, and
 - explain your rights as parents and family members to be involved.

What is a Title I school?

- Title I was passed in 1965 under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). It is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- Title I schools receive extra funding (Title I dollars) from the federal government. These dollars are used to:
 - identify students experiencing academic difficulties and provide assistance to help these students improve academic achievement;
 - purchase additional staff, programs, materials, and/or supplies; and
 - conduct parent and family engagement meetings, trainings, events, and/or activities.



What are my rights?



- The families and parents of Title I students have a right, by law, to:
 - be involved in decisions made at both the school and district level;
 - be provided with information on your child's level of achievement on tests in reading/language arts, writing, mathematics, and science;
 - request and receive information on the qualifications of your child's teacher and paraprofessionals who are working with your child reach out to the campus administrator; and
 - request opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of your child. The school is required to respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

What can Title I funds be used for?

- In general, Title I funds may be used for:
 - smaller class sizes,
 - additional teachers and paraprofessionals,
 - additional training for school staff,
 - extra time for instruction (bootcamps, etc)
 - parent and family engagement activities, and/or
 - a variety of supplemental teaching materials, equipment, and technology.

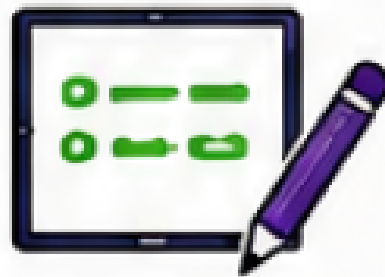
WHAT DOES THIS FUNDING PROVIDE?

Coordinates special education services and supports to help students meet their individualized learning goals.

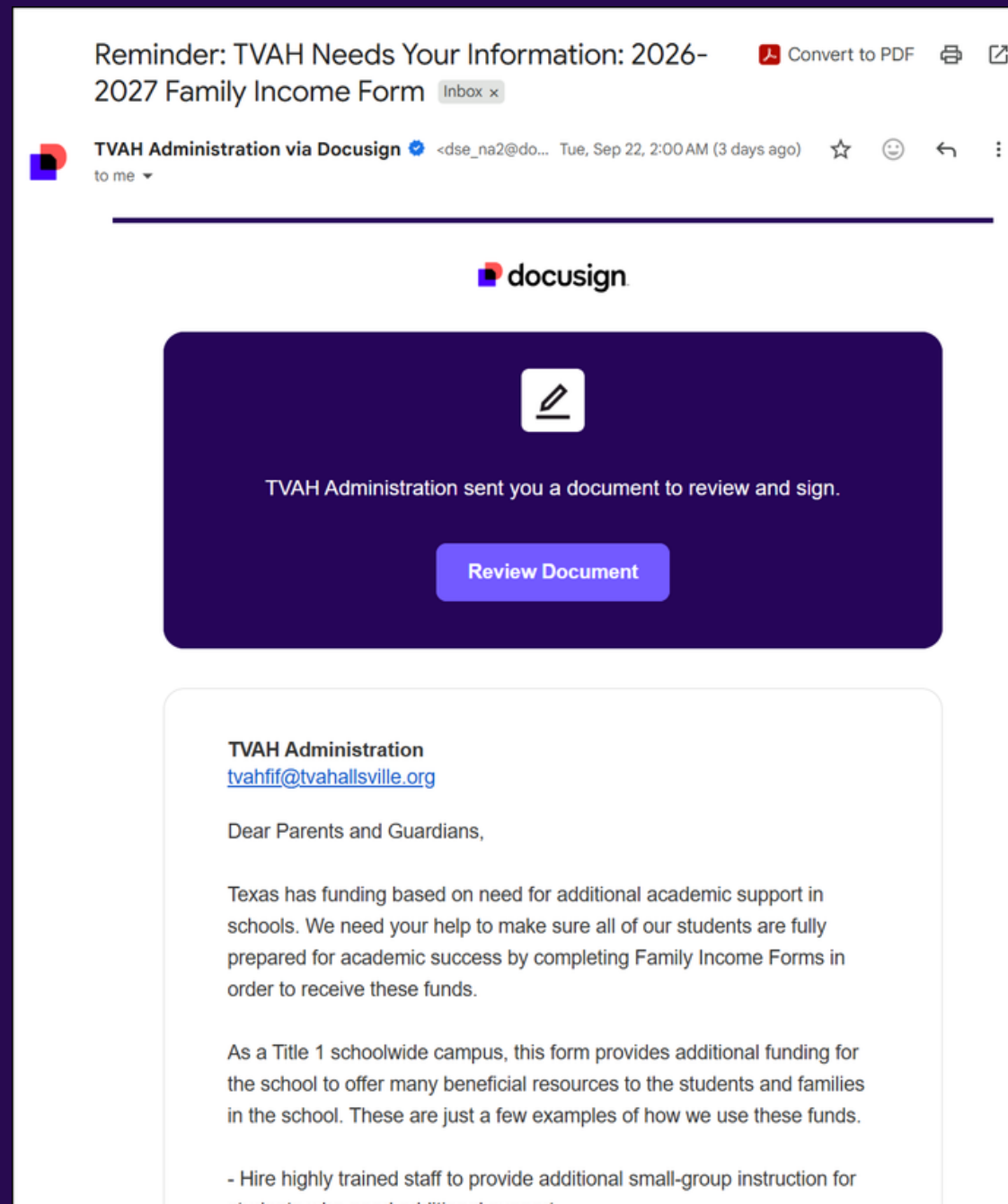

IS MY INFORMATION CONFIDENTIAL?

- ✓ Your information is confidential.
- ✓ It is used only to determine federal funding eligibility.
- ✓ It does not affect your child's grades, services, or school enrollment.
- ✓ Only authorized school staff review the information.

WHY SHOULD EVERY FAMILY COMPLETE THE FORM?

Even if you think you may not qualify, every completed form helps.

Your response helps TVAH:

-  Determine eligibility for federal funding
-  Plan student supports
-  Continue programs and staffing
-  Provide the most accurate picture of our school community

What is the CIP?

- The CIP is the Campus Improvement Plan. It includes:
 - the identification of the school planning team and how they will be engaged in the planning process;
 - a needs assessment and summary of academic and non-academic data;
 - prioritized goals, strategies, and action steps to help address the academic and non-academic needs of students;
 - teacher and staff professional development needs; and
 - budgets and the coordination of resources.
- The school must include family representatives on our school planning team.



What are our schoolwide program goals?



- Help every student grow and succeed academically.
- Prepare students for success after graduation.
- Partner with families to support student learning and achievement.

How is parent and family engagement funded?

- Any district with a Title I allocation exceeding \$500,000 is required by law to set aside 1% of its Title I allocation for parent and family engagement.
- Of that 1%, 10% may be reserved at the district for system-wide initiatives related to parent and family engagement. The remaining 90% must be allocated to all Title I schools in the district.
- You, as Title I parents and family members, have the right to be involved in how this money is spent.

How is parent and family engagement funded?

TVAH receives dedicated parent and family engagement funding. These funds support:

- Parent and Family Engagement Meeting and Events
 - Den Time
 - Outings
 - Prom
- Materials/Supplies for students and families
- Our family ambassador team
- And more!



What is a Parent and Family Engagement Policy?

- These plans address how the district and school will implement the parent and family engagement requirements of ESSA. Components should include:
 - how parents and families can be involved in decision-making and activities;
 - how parent and family engagement funds are being used;
 - how information and training will be provided to families; and
 - how the school will build capacity in families and staff for strong parent and family engagement.
- You, as a Title I parent or family member, have the right to be involved in the development of these plans.

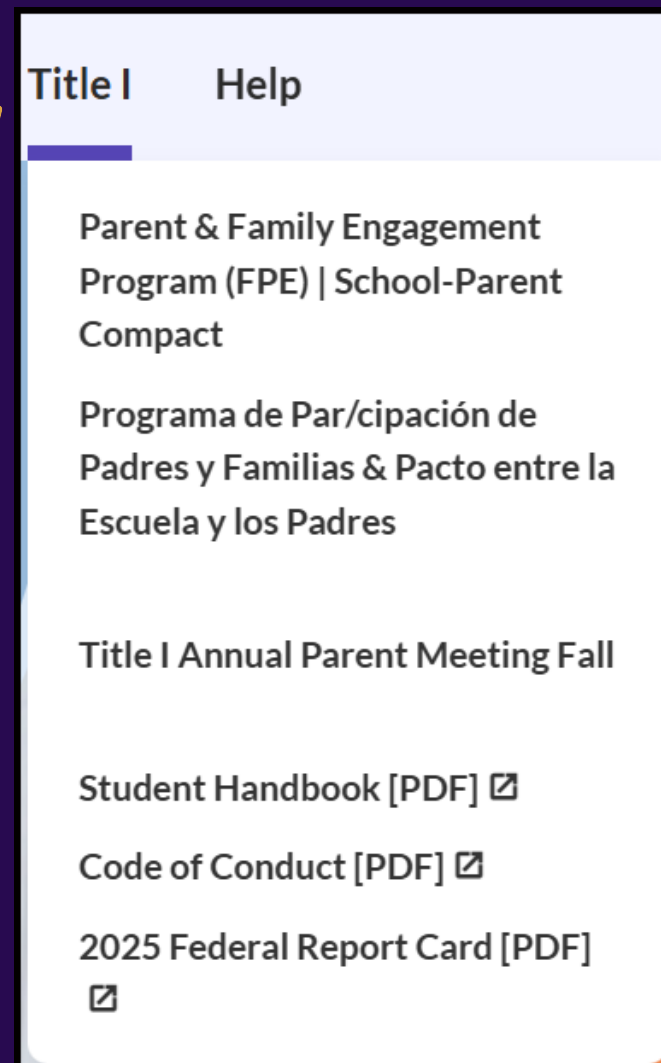

What is a School–Parent Compact?

- A school–parent compact is a written commitment that outlines how the entire school community – teachers, families, and students will share the responsibility for improved academic achievement.
- The compact must describe how the school will:
 - provide high–quality curriculum and instruction;
 - hold parent–teacher conferences, annually in elementary schools;
 - provide parents with reports on their child’s progress;
 - provide parents reasonable access to staff.
 - provide parents opportunities to volunteer; and
 - ensure regular two–way meaningful communication between family members and staff, to the extent practicable, in a language family members can understand.
- You, as a Title I parent or family member, have the right to be involved in the development of the compact.

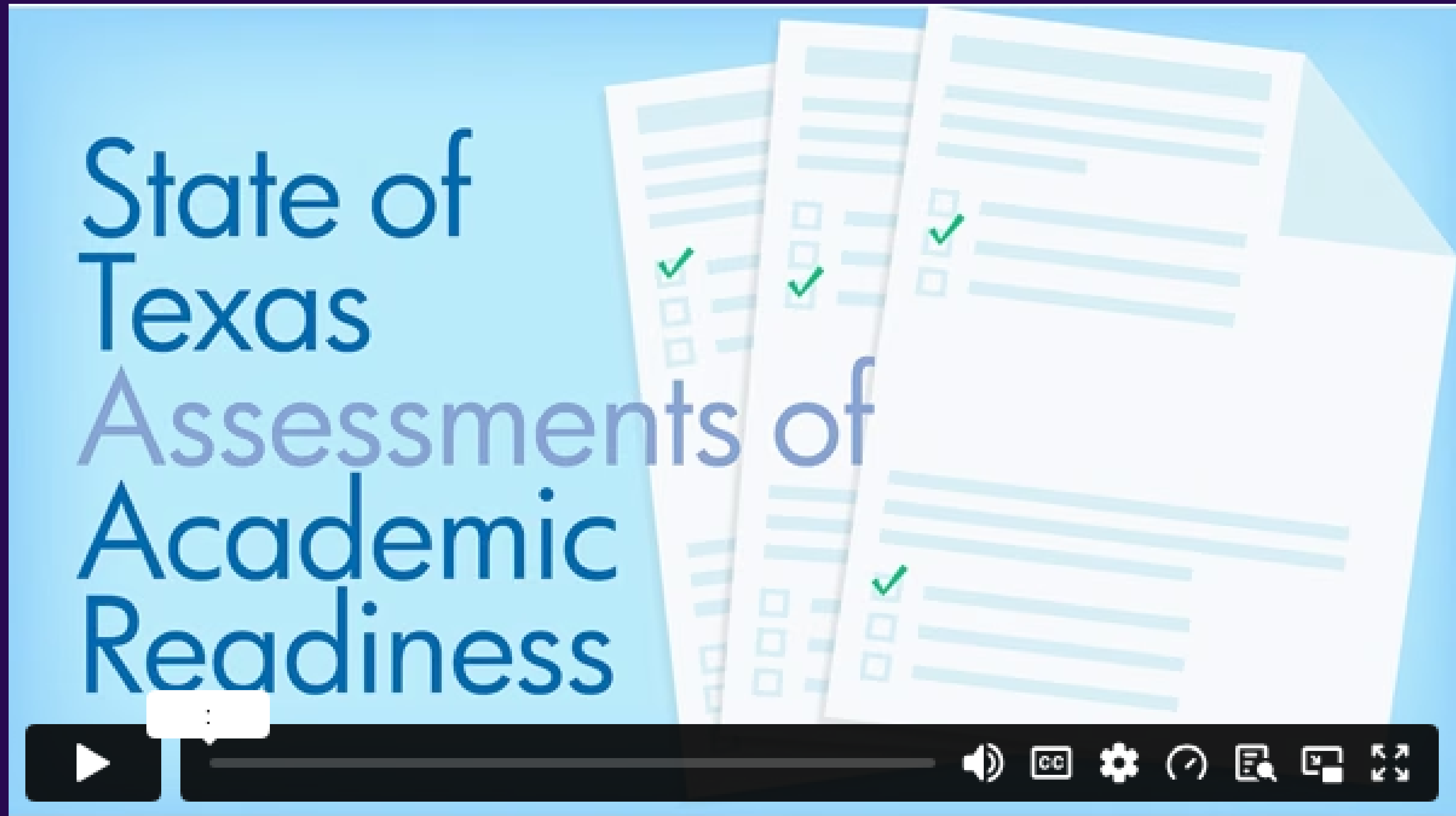
What curriculum does our school use?

Curriculum is what is being taught to your students, how it is being taught, and in what order it is taught!

- The Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) standards are the foundation for all Texas public school curriculum – including TVAH!
 - TVAH balances live instruction (synchronous) with online learning (asynchronous) to ensure students have multiple pathways to show progress and mastery of required standards.
- In STAAR–tested subjects, students receive explicit practice with STAAR question types and research–based instructional strategies to ensure they are ready for STAAR in the spring!
 - To remain in compliance with the expectations of the state and ensure TVAH students are set up for success, we have adopted the Bluebonnet curriculum for 3–5 English Language Arts (ELA), and all STAAR–tested Math courses (3–5, 6–8, and Algebra 1).

Students must earn at least a 70% in their classes to earn credit.

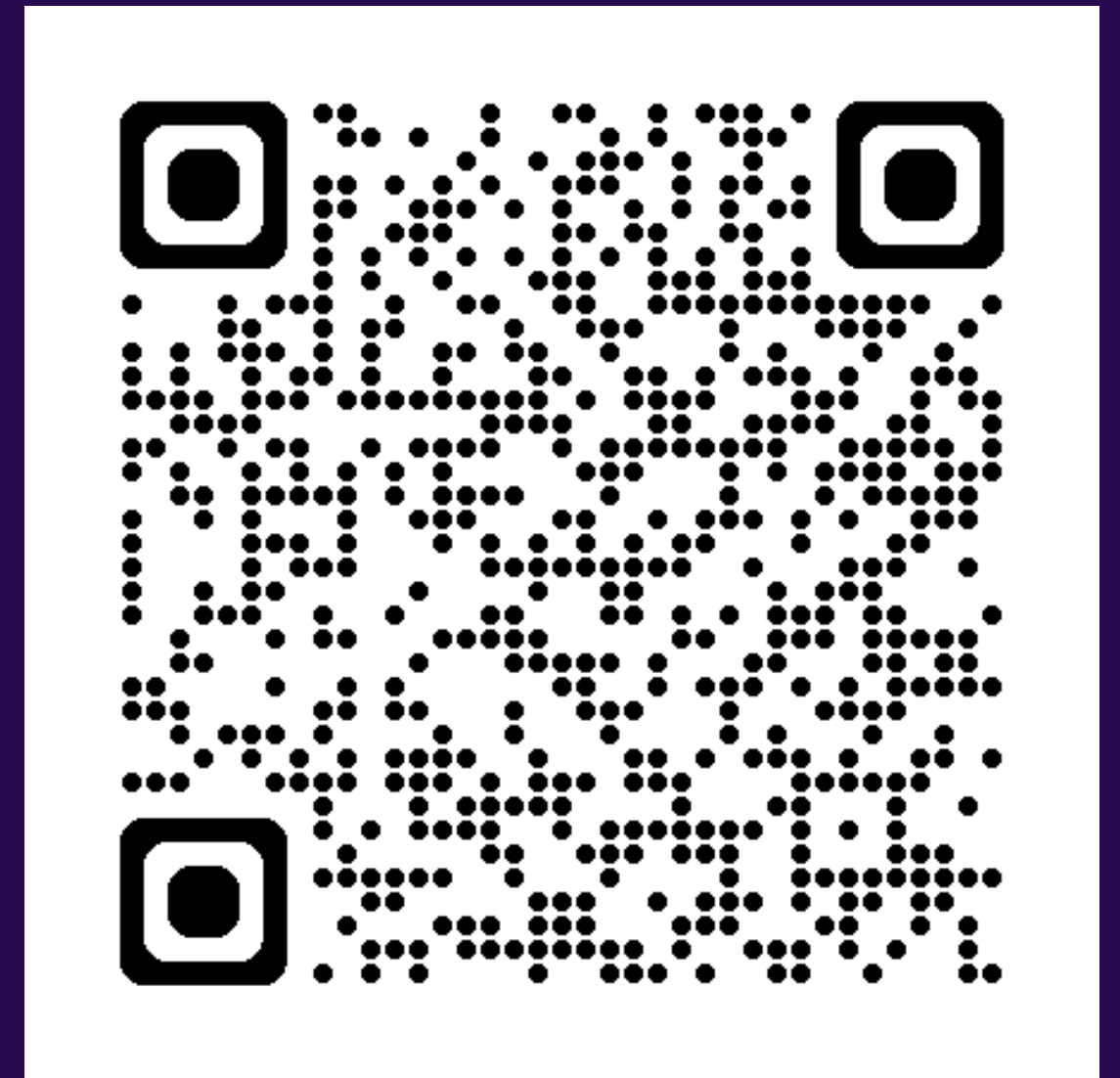
